

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

Vision

Mission

OP Jindal Community College (OPJCC) was established in 2007 as OP Jindal Institute of Technology and Skills (OPJITS). It was later rechristened in 2011 as OPJCC to reflect the commitment of Shri Naveen Jindal, Patron - OPJCC and Chairman - Jindal Steel & Power Limited, towards educational and economic mobility. By supporting Vocational Education and Training of marginalized youth, the Honorable Mr. Jindal is championing educational, social and economic upliftment and harnessing the talents of thousands of Indians to build a stronger, more productive nation. His vision is transforming the skills development space through pedagogy innovations, advocacy and changing public perceptions and attitudes on vocational trades.

Training Methodology & Learner Services

OPJCC students learn in order to earn. Students are taught practical, relevant skills to improve their employability and create jobs. Hands-on training with the latest tools

and equipment is emphasized under the constant supervision of qualified instructors. Lifelong learning is also promoted in response to ever-increasing technological advances in today's industries.

OPJCC is a training center for vocational education in 24 trades related to construction, electrical, mechanical and service sectors as well as paramedical services. New courses are regularly offered based on labour market demands. In addition to technical skills, students are taught communication skills, basic hygiene, health and occupational safety awareness, and other attitudinal and behavioral competencies expected in today's workplace.

Transportation services, counselling, healthy meals, physical fitness, hostels, spiritual development, safety equipment and uniforms, stipends, scholarships, tool kits, insurance, and job fairs are a few of the regular services and benefits offered to OPJCC students.



OPJCC's demonstrated ability to prepare students is a function of three key capabilities:

- Instructor training, monitoring, and development
- State-of-the-art teaching/training equipment and facilities
- Sound management, industry contacts, and international partnerships

To maintain a high standard of instructional quality and to prepare students to work in India and throughout the world, OPJCC's partnerships include Montgomery College (USA), Dudley College (UK), IL&FS, Larsen & Toubro (L&T), Industry Associations like FICCI and CII, among others.

Partnerships

Strategic partnerships add value by providing technical expertise in curriculum development, faculty training, mobilization, on-job training and pedagogy. Workforce investment boards comprising industry stakeholders provide critical input on the relevance of practical training to local and regional workforce needs, quality assurance, and on establishing mechanisms for job seekers and hiring employers to find each other.

Today, OPJCC comprises 5 community colleges located in 3 states, specifically Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Odisha. OPJCC has also adopted 4 Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) under the Government of India's Public Private Partnership (PPP) scheme and offers programmes and certificates under DGE&T MES and NCVT.

Construction

Formwork Carpentry and Shuttering, Masonry, Bar Bending, Plumbing cum Tile Laying, Painting, Pipe Fitting, Finishing Carpentry

Mechanical

Fitter, Turner, Maintenance of Heavy Earth Moving Machines (HEMM), Welding, Repair & Overhaul of Engine Systems

Electrical Sector

Basic Electrical, Transformer/Armature Winding, Industrial Electrical, House Wiring, Refrigeration & AC

Paramedical Programmes

Nursing Aide & Emergency Medical Technician

Service Sector

Computer Hardware Repair, Basic Computers, Tally, Repair of Domestic Electrical Appliances Cutting & Tailoring, Rewinding of Fans & Pumps, Hand-pump Repair

Duration: OPJCC Certificate Courses are 3 to 6 months; NCVT programs are 1 to 2 years; and customised short-term and long-term courses for industry.
